

ARE YOU **REAL ID** READY?

The REAL ID deadline is fast approaching! Starting May 7, travelers will need REAL ID-compliant identification to board domestic flights. Below is a quick guide to help you avoid delays and ensure you're REAL ID ready.

WHAT IS REAL ID?

REAL ID is an enhanced form of identification that meets new federal security standards. REAL ID can take several forms, most commonly a state-issued driver's license or ID card featuring a star icon. Other acceptable forms of REAL ID include: current passports, passport cards, U.S. military IDs, and more. For a full list, visit: DHS.gov/real-id

HOW CAN I VERIFY THAT MY DRIVERS LICENSE OR ID CARD IS REAL ID COMPLIANT?

A REAL ID card will have one of the following marks:











WHERE CAN I GET A REAL ID CARD?

Visit your local DMV. Many locations offer appointments to reduce wait times. Requirements and fees vary by state; we recommend visiting your state's DMV website or contacting them directly for the most accurate and up-to-date information.

WILL MY CHILDREN NEED REAL ID TO TRAVEL WITH ME?

No, children under 18 do not need a REAL ID to fly domestically in the United States. However, REAL ID will be required for any adults traveling with them.

DO I STILL NEED A PASSPORT IF I HAVE A REAL ID CARD?

For international travel, you will still need a passport. For domestic travel, a current passport is considered REAL ID, and can be used in place of a drivers license.
